I am pleased to announce that earlier today I participated on a phone call with Attorney General Loretta Lynch where she announced that payments from the Department of Justice's Equitable Sharing Program will resume immediately. During our call the Attorney General made clear that she recognized the hardship that this suspension caused for many agencies. She also expressed her gratitude for the continued efforts of the state and local law enforcement community throughout this process.

I would also like to state both my appreciation and admiration for the manner in which the law enforcement community met this challenge and, despite the fact that equitable sharing payments were suspended, continued to provide the protection our communities expect and deserve.
