Summary



The governor has now handled all of the bills sent to him by the legislature. I have posted a new report updating the status of all of the bills we have been tracking. These reports are sorted by the category first (criminal law, criminal procedure, etc.) then by the topic instead of by the bill number. Nothing has changed on the report of issues in the conference committee report, but those items are also included in the "pending topic" report.

The biggest pending issues are the bill prohibiting charging fees for reports under 25 pages and the bill on the arrest and search warrant affidavits. Those issues will certainly be up for further discussions when the legislators return to Topeka next Wednesday for the veto session.
