## KS LICENSE PLATES & NEW DRIVER'S LICENSE RESTRICTIONS

You may have noticed, on September 7th, KDOR began issuing KS license plates with seven characters instead of six. This change was intended to address an ongoing issue with duplicate KS plate numbers.





K = CDL Intrastate only

L = CMV without Air Brakes

M = No class A Passenger Vehicle

N = No Class A or B Passenger Vehicle

O = No Tractor Trailer- 5<sup>th</sup> Wheel Coupling

P = No passenger in CMV Bus

V = Medical Variance

W = 3-wheel restriction

X = No cargo CMV tank vehicle

Z = No full air brake in CMV

There are new KS DL restrictions and a change to the KS DL format the way it will return when ran in Kansas Car Stop (KCS)

#### **Violent Person Entries**

- You all are aware that FBI has made the choice to enter Violent Persons on behalf of local agencies.
- When considering whether to keep these entries on file, please note that these are based on conviction information, and are intended for statewide officer safety.
- However, at this time, there is no existing Kansas Statute to require your agencies to keep and maintain these records.
- If you do decide to retain them, we will ask you to pack the records, and maintain a casefile for each, as they will become part of your future audits.

## **NSOR VEHICLE REPORTING**

- Any vehicle that is reported by a registered sex offender MUST be entered in the NCIC record.
- This includes vehicles driven for personal use AND work vehicles, even if the work vehicle is only used during the day.
- If they drive it at ANYTIME, they are required to report it, and your agency is <u>required</u> to enter it.
- This requirement is outlined in Kansas Statute
  22-4907



## **A Quick Note on Cyber Security**

- You may have been warned before to never click a link sent to your email. Sometimes a URL can be disguised as a site you may recognize, making you an easy target for phishing or other types of security threats.
- TIP: Before you click a link, if you hover over the link with your mouse, the name of the website will appear on your screen, this way you will know if it is a familiar site before you click on it.



#### **QR Codes Work in a Similar Fashion!**

- Nowadays, you will often see a QR code, which you can scan with your phone camera, then tap the screen to bring up a link.
- TIP: When using your cell phone camera to scan a QR code, be sure to examine the link on your screen before you tap to visit the site. This may help you in a professional setting, as well as in your personal life!
